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
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
December activities

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January activities

-Mind health: Some groups focused on mental wellbeing, promoting relaxation techniques such as yoga and meditation, to reduce stress and improve focus.

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
February activities

Sofia lonescu-Ogrezeanu was one of the first female neurosurgeons in the world, making significant contributions to brain surgery in Romania. Her pioneering work in neurosurgery inspired women to enter medicine, particularly in highly specialized fields.

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As part of our eTwinning project, we organized a *collaborative activity* that brought together all the participating countries. Using the online platform "Miro," we created a virtual exhibition *showcasing the journey and accomplishments of our project*. Each team contributed by uploading visually captivating posters filled with photos from the various activities we've undertaken since the project's inception.
